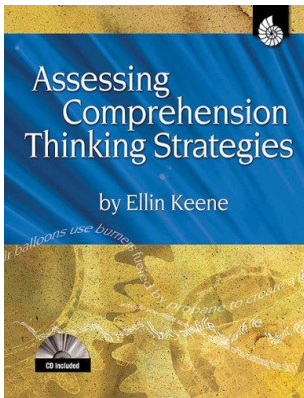

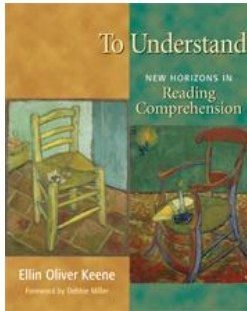
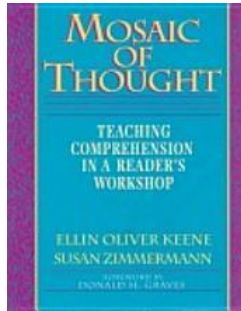

Ellin has been a classroom teacher, staff developer, and adjunct professor of reading and writing. She now consults with schools and districts around the country on a variety of topics. Ellin is co-author of Mosaic of Thought: Teaching Comprehension in a Reader's Workshop, as well as numerous chapters for reading textbooks and education policy journals.



Ellin Oliver Keene helped revolutionize how comprehension is taught across the U.S. Her bestselling book, *Mosaic of Thought* (co-authored with Susan Zimmermann) is now in its second edition, and gathers the current research on comprehension strategies to turn it into powerful teaching for any classroom. Ellin's latest book, *To Understand*, takes this conversation beyond strategy instruction. It challenges educators to consider what it truly means to understand, and offers a vision of classroom instruction that takes students to new depths of engagement and comprehension.

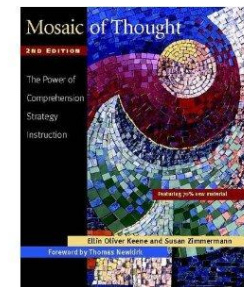
