



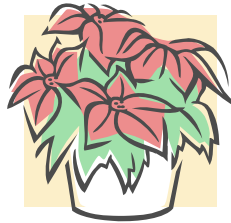

Hello Friends,

The days might be warm, but they are too short and most certainly, too dark. With no snow in sight, it is as if we are hopping on Olympic style sleds ~ Bobsleds, Luge and Skeletons ~ barreling down the Holiday shoot that most often ends with a bit of a break! Phew!

Hopefully, you will all find the moments that make for many memorable occasions with your family and friends ~ filled with fun, and relaxation. In the meantime, we have concerts, projects and units to complete and lots to do before we close our school doors on Wednesday, December 21st.

Young people feel the tension of this season ~ some are too happy, some too sad, some just right ~ but the fairytale ending can sometimes be challenging to find. They are often tired. Sickness is around us and the newness of their class and year has worn off a bit. So how do we help our children to navigate this season so that they can enjoy it?

Edward Thorndike, an expert in social intelligence says we need to develop our interpersonal intelligence and understand that it is crucial to hold and/or be in the process of acquiring, “the ability to understand and manage men and women, boys and girls, to act wisely in human relations.” ~ In all school settings, regardless of the age ~ young children navigate a tricky social world and it is not easy ~Most especially at special times of the year such as the Holiday Season when there are many “extras” added on top of the usual. The Holiday Season brings out our differences. We all celebrate differently. If there has been a loss in a family or community, the Holiday Season can bring out the blues. Children may find themselves playing out some of the stresses in ways they don't understand and it can affect their social lives.



Because of this, we all must be cognizant that our children may need a few extras at home and school to keep happy and healthy. Those extras are not extra gifts, extra events and extra pressures. Katherine Lee, former editor and writer at *Parenting* and *Working Mother* magazines, and the mother of a 10-year-old son, has written numerous articles and essays on parenting and children's health and development for *Parenting*, *Working Mother*, *Wondertime*, *Ladies' Home Journal*, EverydayHealth.com, Sprig.com and About.com. Ms. Lee suggests the following as a simple guide for parents and all to whom children look as authority figures:

- “~Set a calm example.
- ~Set up conditions for good behavior.
- ~Remember the importance of routines.
- ~Watch what he's/she's eating.
- ~Get your child moving (*Save time for regular play and regular playdates.*)
- ~Avoid over-scheduling.
- ~Have your grade-schooler help you. (*Helping to prepare in ways that fit with your family values is a great way to show your child that you are proud of your traditions and that whatever you do as a family is your way of enjoying the time together.*)
- ~Schedule some quiet time.
- ~Remind your child -- and yourself -- what the holidays are really all about.”



Remind them of what is important to your family and why. Reinforce that you are proud of your traditions and that you are interested in the many ways others celebrate as well ~ even if that means not celebrating anything at all. Children need to feel proud of what they are doing especially if it is different from the way many are celebrating. Many social challenges arise when students feel they have to compete as to what is best or the best at this time of year. As always, take time to talk about what is going on and if there are concerns, contact the school. In this way, we all work to provide students with the tools to enjoy and have fun during the Holiday Season.

Dress for the Weather: We go outside on most days ~ unless it is too rainy, too snowy or too cold (wind chill and/or temperature moves to unsafe levels). Because of this, we ask that you send your child to school with proper cold weather attire. Coats, hats or hoods, gloves or mittens, snowpants and boots are all necessary. We cannot let students who do not wear snowpants and boots play in the snow. In these cases, students have to play in restricted areas that are cleared of any snow and their freedom to play is limited.

Greetings from Mrs. Calkins!



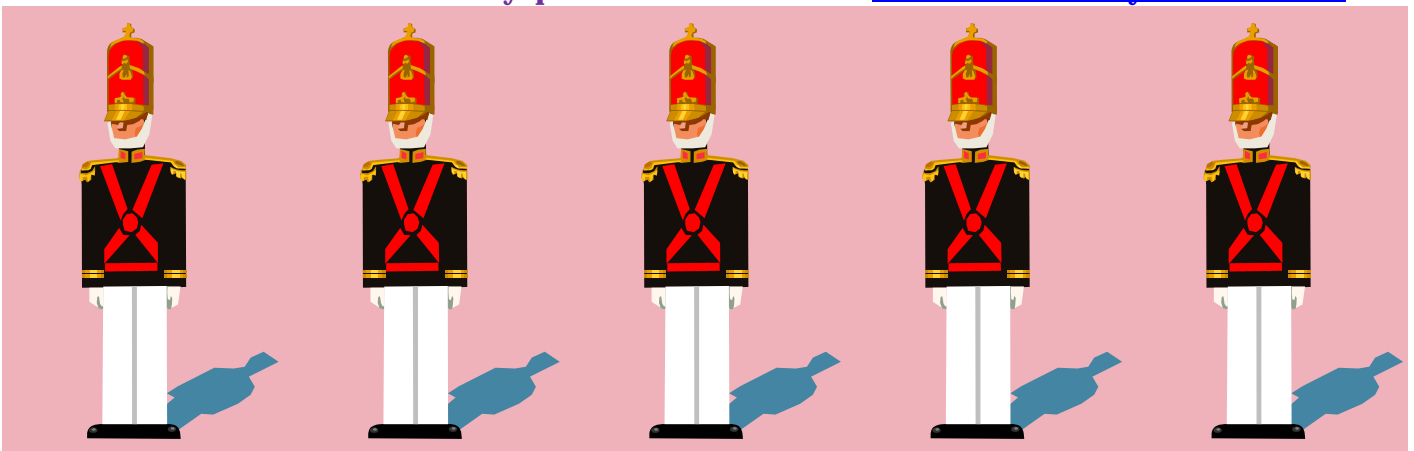
Grade 1

During the month of December, first graders will continue to explore dance as a social activity and experiment with movement as a means of distinguishing formal sections and phrasing in musical works. As a class, they will highlight the musical form of the March from Tchaikovsky's Nutcracker Ballet in a fun and engaging performance activity. We will also add to our repertoire of favorite songs while developing vocal skills.

Grade 2

During the month of December, second graders will continue practicing mallet techniques while exploring the creative possibilities of melodic and rhythmic improvisation. They will learn about a famous and prolific composer, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, who began writing music at a very young age. They will sing an Alleluia melody by Mozart using solfege syllables and then play an arrangement of it on xylophones and metallophones.

News From the Health Room December 2011

STREP THROAT

- There have been an increased number of “strep throat” cases here at Happy Hollow.
- Children that have been diagnosed have had very few symptoms and do not present with fevers.
- The first complaints by your children may be a headache and/or a stomach ache. Children do not necessarily complain about sore throats.
- If your child has these symptoms, you should bring them to their doctor for a throat culture. Some rapid strep tests done in the doctor’s office have been negative, with the throat cultures being positive 48 hours later.
- Children diagnosed with “strep” throat need to be on an antibiotic for 24 hours before returning to school, so they are not contagious to others.
- If medication is required during school time, please ask your pharmacy for a “school bottle” labeled from the pharmacy with medication name, dose, and frequency. We will also need a parent permission form/note.

FLU

- With the flu season upon us, more children may be sent home that come to school with colds/coughs. Your child’s health is an important concern. It is critical that children get the rest that they need to recover from both bacterial and/or viral infections.
- Please check your cell phone throughout the day as parents will be called if your child needs to be sent home.



The most important first line of defense against germs is good hand washing. Please continue to reinforce this at home. We will continue to educate children here at school.

All School Head Lice Screening

- Our next check will be after December school vacation, on Tuesday, January 3, 2012 at 8:45am.
- Please contact Elizabeth Curtin at escurtin@comcast.net if you can help. No experience is necessary as training is available.



4th grade

- Please send in a current medical physical for your child if you have not done so already.
- It is a state mandate that all 4th graders have a current physical on file for the 2011-12 academic school year.

Green Team Tips and Announcement

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

The Wayland Schools Green Team now meets every first Monday of the month at Happy Hollow. Anyone is welcome to join us. On Monday, December 5th, we will meet from 4:00 to 5:30. Food composting, recycling, and gardening continue to expand at our schools:-- Claypit is composting food scraps in the cafeteria and recycling all plastic containers, utensils, aluminum foil, cans and bottles (deep recycling).-- Happy Hollow has started deep recycling in the cafeteria.-- Middle School - The 7th grade is recycling all hard plastics, styrofoam and most food scraps from the cafeteria. Student volunteers are composting the food scraps during study hall.

We are not able to recycle our styrofoam trays (7th grade is an exception) and are throwing away about 270 per day and 5,400 per month. Cheryl Judd is working with the Green Team to consider alternatives to styrofoam.

TIPS:

To conserve energy this winter:

- 1- Test for air leaks next to windows, doors, electrical boxes, plumbing fixtures, electrical outlets, ceiling fixtures, attic hatches and other locations where there is a possible air path to the outside. These areas may need caulking, sealing or weather stripping.
- 2- Adjust your water heater's temperature to between 120 and 125 degrees and save on water heating costs. And if you go away for more than a weekend, turn it down to the "vacation" setting.
- 3- Replace your incandescent light bulbs with compact fluorescents (these save about 70% on lighting cost per light).
- 4- Unplug electronics, TV and other equipment when not in use (using a powerstrip). Turn off your computers at night (this will not harm them). Taken together, these small items can use as much power as your refrigerator.

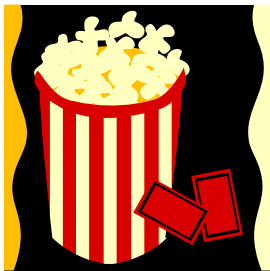


WEB SAVVY? Looking for a way to get involved from home?
