PRINCIPAL’S CORNER

November, 2013

Dear Friends,

We help them make connections and when they connect, they learn. Increasingly so, the challenge is to create the opportunities to help them connect clearly, concisely and consistently in ways that tie academic rigor to social and emotional postures that set them on the path that will ensure their readiness to carry and care for our future so that they will work toward what is “good”. We need them to know how to lead, how to stand strong in convictions that bring virtue to all aspects of their learning process. This is no easy order.

Ancient philosophers contemplated this same order ~ seeking to understand the motivation that would drive the outcome. Plato (427BC – 347BC) said “Human behavior flows from three main sources: desire, emotion and knowledge.” By trying to understand each, he and others from his time made many recommendations applicable to today’s world. So what is different?

We live with a new set of societal platforms across the seas and borders that define our countries. Our children are exposed to conflicting messages that although still flowing from “desire, emotion and knowledge” ~ come at them faster, in sensory-based, stimulating ways. Different from in the past, their virtual world is not solely comprised from their imagination and play that comes from a unified social order. They have many suggestions just a click away ~ be it through television, software, music, art, sports or what they read. They live with the information network and this makes our jobs a bit harder as the adults in their lives.

For example, we can tell them not to swear ~ but they will hear swearing in songs, from sports heroes, actors, in books, from older siblings and it is much more socially acceptable than it was years ago. Society is highly sexualized and messages often center on tying pleasure and immediate gratification to happiness. Something as simple as how to speak and dress requires conversation about places of respect, time and place and making good judgments. More than ever before, it is my opinion that our young need to be involved in conversations about making good decisions in all they endeavor.

I am writing about this because in the wake of all of this week’s celebration over the World Series win ~ we have had school-based shooting and murder, mass shootings and messages that ~ although positive ~ bring the marathon bombing back to center stage. Our young take all of this in at every developmental level and when they lack knowledge and experience to process in a productive way ~ they still process it and it becomes a part of their learning.

Therefore, I would like to encourage all of you to take the opportunity that came in the celebration to discuss what it means to be a championship team. What led to it? I suggest that the championship came about due to excellent teamwork, hard work, dedication, thought tied to action, learning from one’s mistakes, taking pride in one’s work, making a team and/or family proud, remembering to pay tribute to those less fortunate and resiliency. We are talking about the healthy relationships that support the learning that brings the knowledge to tie desire and emotion with all that makes humans good.

Because the stories and happenings of our world ~ both good and bad ~ move faster and hold powerful impact, let’s use every opportunity to talk with our young and process what is going on in a way that helps them connect and combine their academic, social and emotional learning with the kind of judgment that supports good decision-making, strong character-building and the resiliency that puts our future in the hands of those who are ready to lead in ways that make the world a better place.



Their curriculum empowers students to think critically, behave safely and participate responsibly in our digital world. This is a wonderful resource for everyone in this fast paced digital world.

At our October 28th assembly, the tech crew shared Common Sense Media's [Pause and Think Online video](#). Then during technology class, we reviewed the 5 behaviors of a good digital citizen - which all connect to LARK. Green Team Announcement & Tips

The next Green Team meeting is on November 18th at Happy Hollow from 4:00-5:30.

Tips for Saving Energy

- 1- During cold months, lower your thermostat to 68° by day and 60°-62° by night.
- 2- Adjust your water heater's temperature to between 115° and 120° and save on water heating costs. And if you go away for more than a weekend, turn it down to the "vacation" setting.
- 3- Replace your incandescent and CFL light bulbs with LEDs, which are now available at reasonable costs. Look for CREE bulbs, for example, at Home Depot or on Amazon.
- 4- Use powerstrips to plug in all electronics and turn off powerstrips when not in use. This avoids phantom loads. Turn off your computers at night (this will not harm them).
- 5- Test for air leaks next to windows, doors, electrical boxes, plumbing fixtures, electrical outlets, ceiling fixtures, attic hatches and other locations where there is a possible air path to the outside. These areas may need caulking, sealing or weather stripping.,

6th ANNUAL PTO HOLIDAY TOY DRIVE for CHILDREN in FOSTER CARE


